Engage with Children at ASUU!

THIS Sunday, November 9, there will not be a structured children's program nor two adults to supervise unaccompanied children. Parents are welcome to supervise their children in the Sanctuary, or in the informal lounge where they can hear the service on the speaker if their children become too wiggly.

We are delighted to be welcoming children at ASUU! For their benefit and safety, and to be compliant with the conditions of our liability insurance at ASUU, whenever a parent/designated guardian of a child participating in activities of/at ASUU is not present, we are required to have a minimum of two adults who have completed a 2-hour online mandatory-reporting training (and ALL adults are strongly encouraged to complete this training). FOLLOWING BASHO: POEMS FROM JAPAN'S FAR NORTH"

We'll be hosting a very special presentation on Saturday, November 29 at 1:30 p.m. when Michael Czarnecki, a poet from a lovely spot in the Finger Lakes, will inform us about his journey to Japan this fall and share his absolutely wonderful poetry and gorgeous photographs.

He says, "I'll read haiku, tanka and haibun that I'll write while traveling through Japan, along with Bart White, following some of Basho's "Narrow Road to the Far North" route. I'll also accompany the reading with photos from my travels there."

This brief bio is from an interview he did with North Country Public Radio: "Michael Czarnecki is a rare animal--a poet who makes a full-time living through his art. From his home base in the Finger Lakes, he spends many days each year on the road, reading his work and conducting workshops. His company, Foothills Publishing, has brought forward the work of countless other poets in more than twenty years of collections and anthologies." Michael has been to All Souls on two other occasions, once for a poetry reading and then for a memoir writing workshop.
